When we **contrast** two things, we tell how they are **different**.


Read about the two characters:

Meet Sofia. Sofia is an eight year old who lives in Italy. She speaks Italian. Sofia lives in a city called Rome. Sofia lives in an apartment. She shares a room with her brother. Her grandparents live in the apartment upstairs. Every Sunday, she eats dinner with her grandparents. This Sunday, her grandpa made homemade pasta. It was delicious!



Meet Mateo. Mateo is an eight-year-old who lives in Colombia. He speaks Spanish. Mateo lives in a city called Bogota. Mateo lives in an apartment and shares a room with his brother. His grandparents live in the apartment upstairs! Every Friday, he has dinner with his grandparents. This Friday, his grandma made arepas. An arepa is a tasty round bread made from corn that you can fill with cheese or meat. They were delicious!
